ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. The Republic of Sudan (hereinafter the **Recipient**) shall implement the Sudan Family Support Project Additional Financing (P176154) (**the Project**), with the involvement of the following Ministries/agencies/units: Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning/ the Digital Transformation Agency, Ministry of Interior/National Civil Registry Agency (MoI/NCRA), Ministry of Labor and Social Development (MoLSD), and Ministry of Education (MoE). In areas where Government service provision may face challenges in digital or non-digital payment delivery, or where additional system-building support is needed, World Food Program (**WFP**) support will be engaged. WFP has considerable experience implementing cash-based transfers in Sudan. The International Development Association (the **Association**) is acting as administrator of the Sudan Transition and Recovery Support Multi-Donor Trust Fund (MDTF) that is financing the Project.
- 2. The Recipient shall implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, specific documents or plans, Institutional arrangements and capacity requirements, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. The Recipient shall also comply with the provisions of any other E&S documents required under the ESF and referred to in this ESCP, such as the Social Assessment, any Social Management Plan (SMP) and the Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP), and the timelines specified in those documents.
- 4. The Recipient is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the Ministries referenced in 1. above.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Association by the Recipient as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Association will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Recipient through its delegated representatives shall agree to the changes with the Association and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the Recipient shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts, which may include environmental, health, and safety impacts, and gender-based violence.
