Implementation Status and Key Decisions

With the grant agreement signed on November 18, 2015 and the first disbursements made in mid-February 2016, both NGOs are now in early implementation and on track to meet the timelines in their respective 2016 annual work plans. As World Vision implements primarily through field offices who have already been operating during the 2014-2015 pilot phase in 10 of the 11 planned districts for 2016, they have been able to move faster than Save the Children in hiring and training Community Accountability Facilitators (CAFs) and preparing for Information for Citizens (I4C) activities. This timing is also in keeping with the annual Implementation Plan for the Social Accountability Framework (ISAF) cycle which includes

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completing I4C activities by the end of April. SC has recently signed agreements with local NGO partners and begun to recruit CAFs as they scale up from 2 pilot districts to a total of 10 target districts for 2016. Delays in government-led, "supply-side" activities such as training provincial and district officials may affect the availability of service provider performance and budget information and cause delays in "demand-side" awareness building and information dissemination activities by the NGOs. A government training workshop on generating data for information posters held during the first week of April should accelerate the process of information provision and allow implementation to align well with the annual ISAF cycle.

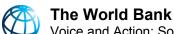

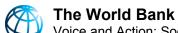
Overall Comments

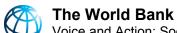

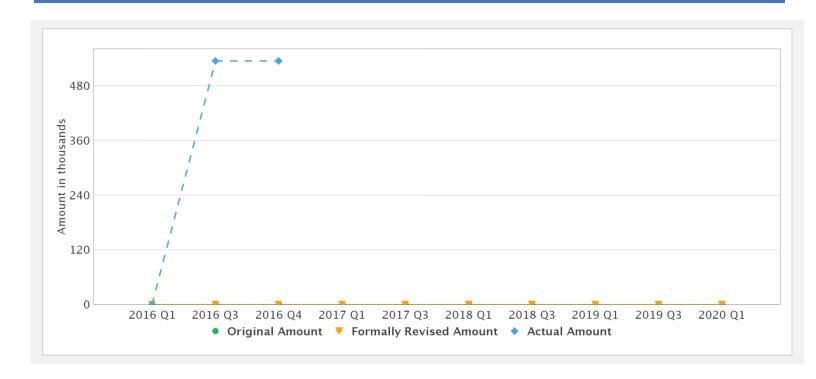
