ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

1. The Republic of Moldova (the Borrower) will implement the Sustainable Transition Through Energy Efficiency in Moldova Project (the Project), with the involvement of the Ministry of Finance, and Ministry of Energy (MoE) through its Moldova Energy Projects Implementation Unit (MEPIU), the National Center for Sustainable Energy (CNED), Termoelectrica, S.A. (TE), and Ministry of Education (MoED), as set out in the Loan Agreement and the Grant Agreement. The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development acting in its own name, and together with the International Development Association, acting as administrator of the Moldova Growth, Resilience and Opportunities for Well-Being Program (M-Grow) Multi-Donor Trust Fund (World Bank) has agreed to provide financing for the Project, as set out in the referred agreements.
2. The Borrower shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. The ESCP is a part of the Loan Agreement and the Grant Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreements.
3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Borrower shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement of the World Bank.
4. As agreed by the World Bank and the Borrower, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Borrower and the World Bank agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the World Bank and the Borrower represented by the Minister of Energy. The Borrower shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
