The Government of Lebanon has requested an extension of the closing date for from December 31, 2009, to June 30, 2011. The World Bank carried out a detailed implementation review mission from October 5-8 and from 15-16, 2009 and the project team has determined that the objectives of the Project continue to be achievable, the implementation performance is rated satisfactorily, and the Government of Lebanon has

prepared a specific action plan and detailed schedule, to complete the outstanding activities within the additional period.

Despite the political uncertainties and deteriorating security conditions in 2007 and during the first half of 2008, the physical reconstruction of the extensive damage caused by the 2006 hostilities has made good progress and is now substantially completed. This priority (funded under Component 1 of the project) received the highest attention as it was urgent to restore the living conditions of the people directly impacted by the conflict. Because it took more time and efforts than initially envisioned to address the population's most pressing needs, the Government is now requesting additional time to fully reap the Grant's expected outcomes.

The proposed extension would allow time for: (a) delivering the 15 community subprojects selected to revive the local economy in the worst affected areas; (b) operationalizing the recently established Municipal Observatory which will allow to progressively introduce a performance-based municipal management system; and (c) carrying out the Municipal Finance Study focusing on (i) the Independent Municipal Fund assessment, (ii) the Property Tax reform, and (iii) the appraisal of the municipalities' overall financial capacity. An Action Plan was prepared by the PCU and was found to be acceptable by the Bank as it will allow completion of pending activities that are central to the long term sustainability of the municipal sector policy dialogue in Lebanon and part of the new Government's policy reform program.
