Implementation Status Overview

The Project has entered its completion phase. Physical reconstruction (Component 1) is now fully completed. There are no pending projects and the temporary/final handovers are completed for the 213 contracts. The Local Development Projects (Component 2) and the Capacity Building Activities (Component 3) are in their final stages. However, several local projects have encountered delays, particularly in Southern Lebanon.

The procurement of the physical work is complete. The procurement processes for Components 2 and 3 are reaching final completion but are still delayed. The disbursement is increasing substantially as the contractors are in the execution phase of the 16 local development projects funded under Component 2 (for a total amount of US\$9 million). The capacity building activities under Component 3 are now functional (Municipal Observatory) or have entered the dissemination phase (Municipal Finance Cell Studies).




