1. Background and Justification

- 1.1. The Closing Gaps (CG) project, initiated in 2012, has collected extensive data on child development, education, and social outcomes in Ecuador, contributing valuable insights for policy development in Ecuador and the region. Because of the relevance of the project, is fundamental to maintain accurate contact information of all participants. However, given the high mobility of the participants and the changing socio-economic environment, updating and maintaining the correct contact information has become a significant challenge. This consultancy will address the need to establish a systematic, cost-effective process to regularly update contact details for participants and their families, allowing for consistent follow-up and ensuring the project's continued success.
- 1.2. In longitudinal studies, maintaining consistent contact with participants is critical for ensuring the integrity of data collection and minimizing attrition bias. By the end of this consultancy, we aim to have a proof of concept of a fully operational and automated system for regularly updating contact information, reducing participant attrition and enabling continued data collection.

2. Objectives

2.1. The objective of this consultancy is to develop a detailed methodology of a cost-effective, sustainable and replicable process to regularly update the contact information of participants and their parents/guardians in the "Closing Gaps" (CG) project. This process is essential for ensuring long-term participant retention and minimizing attrition bias, which is critical for the reliability of the longitudinal data.

3. Scope of Services

- **3.1.** The consulting firm will be responsible for designing, detailing and testing a systematic process that ensures the regular updating of contact information for approximately 28,000 participants in the CG project. The firm must consider the following aspects:
 - 3.1.1. The current state of participant contacts information and identify potential challenges in maintaining accurate and updated data over time.
 - 3.1.2. The need to ensure a high response rate and maintain participant engagement.



- 3.1.3. The technical feasibility of using different data collection methods such as inperson visits, phone calls, digital surveys, or integration with national administrative records.
- 3.1.4. The proposal of a comprehensive methodology of the regular updating of participant information, that should include suggested steps and tools for data collection, verification and updating, as well as recommendations on how to maintain participant engagement.

4. Key Activities

The consultant firm will be expected to carry out the following tasks:

- **4.1.** Needs Assessment: Evaluate the current process of contact information management and identify gaps and challenges that hinder long-term participant tracking.
- **4.2.** <u>Methodology Design:</u> Propose a comprehensive methodology for updating and managing contact information.
- **4.3.** Pilot Testing: Conduct a pilot test of the proposed framework to assess its effectiveness and update the current contact information database.
- **4.4.** Capacity Building: Provide training to the project team on the implementation and management of the methodology, including monitoring and follow-up procedures.

5. Expected Outcome and Deliverables

The following deliverables are expected from this consultancy:

- **5.1.** Product 1 Initial Work Plan & Design Proposal
 - 5.1.1. A detailed work plan outlining the steps and timeline for developing the systematic process.
 - 5.1.2. Proposal of the design for the process, including the suggested steps and strategies for regular updates of participant contact information.
- **5.2.** Product 2 Pilot Implementation Report
 - 5.2.1. Report on the implementation of the pilot test of the contact update system.
 - 5.2.2. Documentation of the challenges and lessons learned from the pilot phase.
 - 5.2.3. Recommendations for implementation based on the pilot results.
- **5.3.** Product 3 Final Database & Report
 - 5.3.1. Up-to-date contact information database for the CG participants.
 - 5.3.2. Detailed final report of the replicable methodology including the workflow, maintenance plan, recommendations and analysis of the updating contact information process.

1. Background and Justification

- 1.1. The CG project seeks to extend its impact by collecting new data on critical social and economic factors such as labor market participation, crime exposure, education, and migration. These data points are pivotal in shaping public policies that address inequality, crime prevention, and youth development in Ecuador and the broader region. As the country faces significant socio-economic challenges, understanding how young people transition from education to the labor market and how crime exposure affects their outcomes is essential for creating effective policy interventions.
- 1.2. This consultancy will contribute by designing and implementing comprehensive data collection processes, ensuring that the collected data is representative and accurate. The final dataset and accompanying analysis will provide actionable insights into labor market conditions, crime exposure, and the broader social environment for policymakers.

2. Objectives

2.1. The objective of this consultancy is to design and implement a data collection process to gather new information from participants of the "Closing Gaps" (CG) project. This data will cover critical areas such as labor market participation, educational attainment, exposure/participation in crime, risky behaviors, migration, domestic violence, and teen pregnancy. The goal is to ensure that the information collected is high-quality, comprehensive, and can be integrated with existing longitudinal data and administrative records. Additionally, the consultancy will evaluate the representativeness of the sample used in the survey compared to the full universe of CG participants.

3. Scope of Services

- **3.1.** The consultant firm will be tasked with developing and executing a data collection strategy to collect detailed information on approximately 14,000 participants that have been part of the project since 2012. This will require:
 - 3.1.1. Identifying the best methods for data collection (in-person, telephone, digital platforms, etc.) depending on the type of data and regional context.
 - 3.1.2. Ensuring the safety and security of the participants and data collectors, especially



in high-risk areas.

- 3.1.3. Working in coordination with national entities to cross-reference data collected with existing administrative records (e.g., labor market records, social security, medical records, crime statistics).
- 3.1.4. Evaluating the sample of participants used in the survey and analyzing its representativeness in relation to the broader universe of CG participants.
- 3.1.5. Designing user-friendly data collection instruments that are adapted to the specific needs of the project, ensuring minimal participant burden and maximizing response rates.

4. Key Activities

The consultant firm will be expected to carry out the following tasks:

- **4.1.** <u>Instrument Design:</u> Design data collection instruments tailored to different topics (labor, education, crime, etc.), ensuring that the instruments are culturally appropriate and methodologically sound.
- **4.2.** <u>Pilot Testing:</u> Conduct pilot tests to validate the instruments and assess their effectiveness, ensuring that they accurately capture the required data and can be efficiently administered.
- **4.3.** Sample Design and Analysis: Develop a sampling strategy and conduct an analysis of the representativeness of the surveyed sample, comparing demographic, socioeconomic, and educational variables against the full universe of CG participants.
- **4.4.** Data Collection Strategy: Develop a strategy that outlines the timing, frequency, and methods for collecting the data, with a focus on balancing quality and cost-efficiency.
- **4.5.** Fieldwork Planning: Coordinate the logistics of data collection, including staffing, training of enumerators, and ensuring participant safety.
- **4.6.** Cross-Referencing with Administrative Data: Establish a process to integrate the new data with administrative records from national entities such as social security systems, education departments, and law enforcement agencies.
- **4.7.** <u>Data Quality Assurance:</u> Implement quality control measures during and after the data collection to ensure the reliability and validity of the information collected.

5. Expected Outcome and Deliverables

The following deliverables are expected from this consultancy:

- **5.1.** Product 1 Initial Work Plan & Data Collection Strategy
 - 5.1.1. Comprehensive work plan detailing the methodology for data collection, including the survey design and timeline.
 - 5.1.2. Strategy for ensuring sample representativeness and adjusting for any biases or challenges in fieldwork.

5.2. Product 2 – Fieldwork Report

- 5.2.1. Intermediate report on the progress of data collection, including issues encountered in the field and how they were resolved.
- 5.2.2. Initial findings on sample representativeness and any adjustments made to the sampling frame.



5.3. Product 3 – Final Dataset & Analysis Report

- 5.3.1. Clean, organized dataset covering the key variables collected in the survey, ensuring adherence to data quality standards.
- 5.3.2. Final analysis report that includes a thorough review of the sample's representativeness, along with descriptive statistics and a discussion of any limitations.
- 5.3.3. Recommendations for future waves of data collection based on lessons learned.
