## II. Objective and Justification

While the countries in the Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) region have generally made progress in statistical production in recent years, production, dissemination and the use of statistics do not function as a system in the majority of the countries of the region. Institutional capacities of the National Statistics Systems (NSS) are still limited, which limits the use of statistical information for decision making and policy formulation. The LAC region would benefit from learning from an experience of a country that has developed an effective coordination between organizations that provide data, statistics producers and data users. The Bank's preliminary research and dialogue with the authorities from the Republic of Korea (Korea) show that this country's statistical development experience is relevant for LAC. The objectives of this regional TC are: i) build capacities in statistical development by sharing strategies and exchanging information on the current situation of the NSS between select countries in the LAC region and Korea; and ii) to identify areas of future collaboration between Korea and LAC related to statistical capacity development.

# III. Description of activities and outputs

Activity: Sharing knowledge to promote statistical capacity. The TC will finance a joint seminar between the Bank and Statistics Korea (KOSTAT) to examine the Korean experience in statistical development and how the lessons learned apply to the LAC region. The seminar, to be held in Daejeon, Korea during the first semester of 2013, will bring together directors of national statistics offices (NSO) and policy makers to share experiences about strengthening the NSS with a focus on closing the gap between the production and use of statistics. Following the three-day seminar, KOSTAT will conduct a two-day study tour for the seminar participants to visit a statistics office outside of Daejeon. They also visit several data users from the private sector. The outcome will be that the participants from both Korea and LAC will be informed about each other's experiences and lessons related to strengthening NSS.

The expected results of the seminar and study tour will be proposals for future KOSTAT cooperation in LAC in areas related to statistical capacity building. In order to begin this cooperation, the seminar's discussions will lead to a concrete plan for KOSTAT to provide technical assistance to a NSO in the LAC region. The plan will detail the type of assistance, the area of focus, the target country, participants and timetable. The Bank will continue working with KOSTAT to promote the development and strengthening of NSS in the region, with an emphasis on knowledge sharing, capacity building and operational support.

# IV. Budget

The total cost of the CT is US\$195,000 of which the Bank will finance US\$185,000 and US\$10,000 will be in-kind counterpart financing.

## V. Executing agency and execution structure

As a mitigation measure, the Bank will encourage participation by supporting their travel expenses and also by extending invitations to the countries well in advance.
