Project Description	The government of the Republic of Serbia has taken rigorous measures to contain the spread of the COVID-19 virus. After declaration of the State of Emergency on March 16, 2020, strict measures have been applied progressively, such as: (i) closure of all kindergartens, primary schools, high schools and universities; (ii) forced quarantine for all those above 65 years of age; (iii) a curfew starting from March 18, 2020; (iv) closure of public parks, gyms, restaurants, bars and shopping malls, (v) closure of all national borders for passenger transport and shut-down of the international airport; (vi) shut-down of inner-city public transport (except for a few special lines in the morning and afternoon for those that have to go work and cannot work from home), intercity bus and rail transport; and (vii) a mandatory 15 days or 28 days self-quarantine for those entering Serbia depending on the country of origin. All these measures helped the country contain the COVID-19 virus and preserve the lives of people. As per the World Health Organization, by 4 May 2020, there have been 9,464 confirmed cases of COVID-19 with 193 deaths in the country. The country's medical system is now under high pressure to provide adequate protection to medical workers and proper treatment to patients, facing the increasing number of confirmed cases. The proposed Project aims to provide support to improve protective measures in hospitals in Serbia. Activities under the Project will cover, but not be limited to, the procurement of medical supplies, medical and personal protective consumables, medical equipment (i.e., monitors and ventilators), reagents, COVID19 tests, medicines for treatment, etc.		
Objective	The objective of the Project is to strengthen the capacity of the public health sector in Serbia through providing emergency support, including the purchase and provision of medical protective supplies and equipment.		
Expected Results	The key results indicators may include:		
	a) Number of designated health facilities with COVID-19 diagnostic equipment, test kits, and reagents as per		

	WHO guidelines. b) Number of health facilities with adequant personal protection equipment. c) Number of personnel trained under the Project on COVID-19 preparedness and response.		
Environmental and Social Category	Category B		
Environmental and Social Information	AllB's Environmental and Social Policy (ESP) including the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and Environmental and Social Exclusion List (ESEL) apply to this Project. Given the emergency nature of this Project, a phased approach for addressing environmental and social (ES) risks and impacts, permitted under the ESP for Situations of Urgent Need of Assistance, has been adopted.		
	The Project has been categorized as Category B and an Environmental and Social Management Planning Framework (ESMPF) will be used as the Project's ES instrument. Under the phased approach, the ESMPF may be deferred to the Project implementation phase. Consequently, AIIB may approve the Project prior to the preparation of the ESMPF and the field-based ES due diligence.		
	Given the nature and potential of spread of the COVID-19 pathogen, the ES risks are considered to be significant by AIIB. However, adverse environmental and social impacts are expected to be manageable, because the main activities under the Project are to procure medical supplies, medical and personal protective consumables, medical equipment (i.e., monitors and ventilators), reagents, COVID-19 test kits, medicines for treatment, etc. Management of exposure of medical staff to communicable diseases and management of medical waste will be considered in the Project to mitigate risks and enhance positive impacts.		
	A project level Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) will be included as an element of the ESMPF.		
	The ESMPF in English and Serbian will be disclosed by the Borrower on its website. This documentation will also be disclosed on AIIB's website.		
Cost and Financing Plan	Total cost estimate is Euro 220 million, of which AIIB loan is around Euro 200 million and the balance will be covered by the Government of Serbia.
