In such circumstances, the Recipient/ or delegate(s)] will agree to the changes with the Association and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient/ or delegate(s)]. The Recipient/ or delegate(s)] will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 6. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the Recipient shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
