This is compounded by the underinvestment in roads and public transit. Many entrepreneurs could help fill this gap, but need vehicles more appropriately designed for the environment. The lowest income consumers cannot afford to buy a car, but do need access to relevant transport to move around effectively. Mobius contributes to the evolution of vehicle options in Africa, addressing the needs of millions of the most disadvantaged who remain cut-off from accessible, affordable transportation.
Proposed OPIC Loan:	In order to serve the basic transportation needs of the African market, Mobius has reimagined the car by excluding costly technologies such as air-conditioning and interior fixtures while maximizing durability for inadequate roads, with substantial suspension and handling. The result is a vehicle with the performance of an off-road car, priced similarly to second-hand, foreign imports. Mobius vehicles empower entrepreneurial buyers to run many types of businesses: from public transport, to mobile medical care, mail delivery to goods delivery. These businesses will help change the capacity and utility of Africa's transport network by connecting end-users to hospitals, schools and markets in urban settings as well as the most rural areas.
