Project Description

DESCRIPTION

The proposed Second Kathmandu Valley Water Supply Improvement Project will build on ongoing efforts of the Government of Nepal and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to further improve water supply availability, services and planning in the Kathmandu Valley (the Valley').

PROJECT RATIONALE AND LINKAGE TO COUNTRY/REGIONAL STRATEGY

The proposed project will improve access and service quality of water supply services in the Valley by (i) financing the remaining investment gaps for Melamchi water source development, (ii) rehabilitating and expanding the water supply distribution system, and (iii) further strengthening the Kathmandu Valley's water supply and sanitation institutions.

IMPACT

Access to and quality of drinking water services enhanced (National Drinking Water Standards 2005; Government of Nepal's Thirteenth Plan, 2013/14 2015/16)

OUTCOME

High-quality and sustainable water supply services provided to residents of the Kathmandu Valley, including the poor

CONSULTING SERVICES

Implementing agencies will recruit consulting firms in accordance with ADB's Guidelines on the Use of Consultants (2013, as amended from time to time). Six individual consultants (17.5 person-months) and one firm comprising 7 international consultants (20 person-months) and 9 national consultants (31 person-months) will be engaged by ADB to undertake the technical assistance in accordance with ADB's Guidelines on the Use of Consultants (2013, as amended from time to time). The firm will be engaged using Quality and Cost-Based Selection with 90:10 selection method and full technical proposal. Estimated budget for the firm is \$800,000.

PROCUREMENT

Procurement of works and goods will be carried out in accordance with ADB's Procurement Guidelines (2015, as amended from time to time).
