Project Description

The rationale of this project is in line with two policies of ADB, i.e. 'Strategy 2030: Achieving a Prosperous, Inclusive, Resilient, and Sustainable Asia and the Pacific' and 'Climate Change Strategic Framework 2017-2030'. As stated in these policies, ADB vows to support its Developing Member Countries (DMC's) in "tackling climate change, building climate and disaster resilience, enhancing environmental sustainability, and strengthening governance and institutional capacity".

This project is in the form of Transactional Technical Assistance (TRTA). According to the bank document, "the proposed TRTA facility will scale-up activities of and build upon outputs from South Asia Department's (SARD) earlier regional climate change initiatives such as the small-scale capacity development TA 8292-REG: Preparing for Climate Action South Asia and the regional knowledge support TA 8572-REG: Action on Climate Change in South Asia."
