Project Description

According to the bank document, the project provides \$3 million grant under the Asia Pacific Disaster Response Fund (APDRF) as emergency assistance to the Government of Indonesia in response to a 4.7 magnitude earthquake occurred on 28 September 2018 near the city of Palu, Central Sulawesi, Indonesia.

As per the situation report from the ASEAN Humanitarian Assistance (AHA) center, at least 1,424 people were confirmed to have died, 2,549 injured, 113 missing and 70,821 people displaced, while electricity and communications have been disrupted, road severely damaged, and 66,238 houses damaged. The displaced population are living in tents in over 141 sites or have no shelter. Liquefaction has been reported, with black mud rising up to five meters and reportedly burying one hundred people alive in Petobo village in Palu.

The project, therefore, seeks to support the settlement and social recovery of affected people.
