### Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the proposed regional technical assistance (TA) will support demand-driven needs, capacity and systems assessments, knowledge and advisory services, and project preparation and implementation support for human and social development (HSD) projects in two developing member countries (DMCs) in Central Asia: Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan. This will include support to health, education, and social protection projects as well as other HSD-related initiatives that may be proposed by other DMCs in Central Asia (i.e. the Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, and Turkmenistan), including on public-private partnerships, climate change, innovative financing, technology-enabled solutions, and multi-sectoral approaches.
