Project Description

According to the Bank's website, DGT is currently focusing its reform efforts on digitalization and modernization of business processes under the 'Core Tax Administration System (CTAS) project, which is expected to become fully operational by mid-2024. The digital infrastructure for the CTAS has been developed for DGT by an external IT service provider. Once the system is fully operational, it will be handed over to the CTAS team within DGT, who will thereafter be fully responsible for operating, maintaining, and updating the system and its software. The government of Indonesia has requested ADB to support building the internal capacity of staff in the CTAS team on the digital technologies that feature in the system, so that DGT can independently operate, administer, and manage the system effectively once it's handed over.
