Project Description

As stated by the ADB, the transaction involves a loan of up to \$20,000,000 or its local currency equivalent to Private Joint-Stock Commercial Bank Davr Bank (Davr) for the Davr Supporting Inclusive Access to Finance for Micro, Small, and Medium-Sized Enterprises Project in Uzbekistan.

The project aligns with ADB's country partnership strategy (CPS) for Uzbekistan, 2024-2028, which prioritizes private sector and competitiveness development. It is expected to contribute to the related CPS outcome: public and private sector productivity boosted.
