Project Description

As stated by the ADB, the project will improve the public transportation network with low emission transport modes in district headquarters (7 cities) - Peshawar; (ii) Mardan; (iii) D.I. Khan; (iv) Bannu; (v) Kohat; (vi) Abbottabad; and (vii) Mingora.

The absence of a formal public transport network has created significant mobility challenges in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, hence, the need to improve urban mobility in the seven cities by introducing an efficient and low emission public transport system.

The implementing agency will be the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Urban Mobility Authority.
