The development of the financial sector and its importance as an enabler of economic growth and climate resilience are highlighted in the government's National Medium-Term Development Plan (2025-2029). A key aspect of the program involves strengthening the regulatory and policy landscape to increase the flow of sustainable investments that would help Indonesia's transition to a low-carbon and climate-resilient future in accordance with its Nationally Determined Contribution targets.

The implementing agency will be the Ministry of Finance Directorate General of Budget Financing and Risk Management.
