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### **Project Description**

As stated by the AfDB, the objective of the project is to strengthen Eastern Africa Power Pool (EAPP) institutional capacity to establish and manage a grid coordination platform for regional power trade, with the ultimate goal of increasing access to reliable, sustainable and affordable green electricity in the Eastern Africa region.

The direct beneficiaries of the capacity-building activities are the Eastern Africa Power Pool (EAPP) and the utilities from the 13 EAPP Member Countries. These benefits will trickle down to electricity users in the EAPP Member countries who will benefit from enhanced access to reliable and affordable power since a competitive regional pool is expected to lead to a reduction in the cost of energy.

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### **Private Actors Description**

As stated on the agency's website, the goal of EAPP is to be a framework for pooling energy resources, promoting power exchanges between utilities in Eastern Africa in order to secure their respective power supply, provide mutual assistance in case of failure in their respective power systems and reduce power supply costs based on an integrated master plan and preestablished rules (Grid code).

There are currently ten (13) member countries of the Eastern Africa Power Pool (EAPP) who have signed the Inter-Governmental MOU (IGMOU). Utilities and national regulators become members of the EAPP once their country signs the IGMOU.
