Project Description

As stated by the AIIB, the project development objective is to reduce landfill waste and generate renewable energy by processing municipal solid waste in North Dhaka, Bangladesh.

The Project involves the design, financing, engineering, construction, operation, and maintenance of a waste-to-energy (WtE) facility located on the south side of the Amin Bazar landfill in North Dhaka and a six-kilometer transmission line to be connected to the Savar substation. It comprises four incineration lines and two sets of 35 MW turbo-generator systems. It is the first WtE project in Bangladesh to divert municipal solid waste from landfill and generate renewable energy.

The Project benefits from a series of project agreements for 25-year, including Implementation Agreement (IA) with the Government of Bangladesh (GoB), Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with BPDB, Waste Supply Agreement (WSA) with Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC), and Land Use Agreement (LUA) with DNCC.



Investment Description

- Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB)

As stated by the AIIB, the total project cost is around USD467 million, which is expected to be funded by USD157 million equity and USD310 million debt. AIIB's financing amount will be up to USD100 million.



Private Actors Description

As stated by Bloomberg, China Machinery Engineering Corporation contracts international engineering projects. The Company constructs thermal power plants, hydro power plants, power station projects and communication projects. Furthermore, the Company also offers import and export services in electric meters, electro-optic light and castings products.

WTE Power Plant North Dhaka Private Limited is a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) of China Machinery Engineering Corporation.

The PPM provides an opportunity for an independent and impartial review of submissions from Project-affected people who believe they have been or are likely to be adversely affected by AIIB's failure to implement the ESP in situations when their concerns cannot be addressed satisfactorily through Project level GRMs or AIIB Management processes. Two or more project-affected people can file a complaint. Under the current AIIB policy, when the bank co-finances a project with another development bank, it may apply the other bank's standards.
