Project Description

According to the bank website, the objective of this project is a critical component of Senegal's power generation and sustainable energy growth plan by adding 33MW of power onto the Senegalese grid. The Expansion Project will complement the adjacent and original 52.9MW combined-cycle thermal power plant currently under construction. Together the Expansion Project and the Existing Projects will operate on heavy fuel oil with an option to convert to natural gas, in Cap des Biches, approximately 27km from Dakar, Senegal.
