Project Description

According to the bank website, DFC will provide political risk insurance to Citibank N.A., which has an expected projected capital investment of \$49 million over the next three years, covering certain of its operations in the Sub Saharan African (“SSA”) and Middle Eastern & North African (“MENA”) regions protecting Citi’s property and equity investments against political risk and the risks of inconvertibility and expropriation. These investments will result in the continuation and deepening of the U.S. private sector best practices in SSA and MENA financial markets. Growth and stability in the financial sector are key to the diversification and expansion of private enterprise and sustainable economic growth across these regions.
