## **Project Description**

According to NDB documents, the proposed project is expected to have a highly developmental impact by expanding the availability of working capital for MSMEs in India, including smallholder farmers. While most businesses in India have limited access to financing due to numerous market constraints and a financial crisis precipitated by the COVID-19 pandemic, small businesses, and especially smallholder farmers, find it exceptionally difficult to secure financing. The Project will focus on lending to under-served borrowers by targeting 60 percent of its loans to MSMEs located in rural areas, and 40 percent to FPOs and smallholder farmers.
