According to the Bank, the Project is expected to have a highly developmental impact in Ecuador through the provision of financial services to microenterprises. Despite their importance to the Ecuadorian economy, microenterprises lack the necessary access to financing. In Ecuador, the microfinance financing gap is estimated at \$2.2 billion, with a specific gap of women micro-entrepreneurs estimated at \$266 million. In addition, Ecuador's commercial capitol, Guayaquil, has been one of the hardest-hit areas of COVID-19 in Latin America with a poverty rate of 14% and the highest rate of 1 Over the next five years, DFC funding will support an estimated 28,000 microentrepreneurs in Guayaquil.
