Project Description

A loan portfolio guaranty of qualifying loans to micro, small, and medium private enterprises. The guaranty facility will be used to mitigate risk associated with lending to Venezuelan migrants and Colombian receptor communities.

This Project is expected to have a highly developmental impact with loans to support micro-clients in Colombia, which are directly impacted by the economic crisis in Venezuela that has sent more than a million migrants across the border into Colombia. Loans supported by this Project will include support for both businesses operated by Venezuelan migrants in Colombia and businesses operating in areas hosting these migrants. The micro financing gap in Colombia is estimated at \$4 billion. The Project will partner with Technical assistance provided by USAID and will target its lending exclusively to regions classified by USAID as having high populations of displaced migrants.
