Fusion serves low-income women borrowers residing in India's poorest regions, and its products are designed to meet their needs, especially those who were previously unbanked. Fusion also provides women borrowers with business, financial, and digital literacy trainings. In addition, the project will create hundreds of new jobs in states that are experiencing high levels of unemployment, emigration, and poverty.
