Project Description

According to DFC, the proposed project is to support expansion of a fruit distribution business in India.

The Project is anticipated to have a highly developmental impact on the Indian economy through support for a company with inclusive supply chains, which will lead to job creation and human capital development. The Borrower sources its agricultural commodities primarily from smallholder farmer-collectives and works with these farmers to improve agricultural practices. For example, the selective use of fertilizer and pesticides can lead to a 30 to 40% increase in farmers' incomes. Furthermore, the Project's modern infrastructure (packhouses, cold stores, ripening centers) are anticipated to reduce wastage, and increase shelf life by as much as 50% allowing access to long-distance markets and improving food security.
