Project Description

The Project is marine conservation in the Galápagos Islands. DFC political risk insurance will support marine conservation enabled through a debt conversion that is expected to create (i) at least \$323 million of dedicated funding, managed by a conservation trust fund (the "Foreign Enterprise"), for near- and long-term biodiversity protection and management of a newly created marine reserve, the Reserva Marina de Hermandad, and the Galápagos Marine Reserve, and (ii) an improved debt profile for the Republic of Ecuador.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION

Unlike many other development finance institutions, DFC does not currently have an access to information policy.

Under the United States Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), DFC is obliged to respond to reasonably formulated requests for Agency records.
