This project involves technical assistance to develop and implement climate adaptation activities for One Acre Fund's smallholder clients. The technical assistance includes carbon markets and smallholder agroforestry activities, development of improved smallholder insurance products, and smallholder agricultural resilience capacity building. The technical assistance will improve the developmental impact of DFC's \$20,000,000 loan to One Acre and improve the commercial sustainability of One Acre, which aims to reach an additional 412,000 farmers by 2031.
