According to the Bank's website, the project provides funding to Abastumani Sanatorium Resort Arazindo LLC to finance the remodeling of a three-floor sanatorium built in 1920 into an upscale hotel with 76 guestrooms, restaurant with the terrace, spa, fitness center, food and beverage areas, meeting/conference rooms, offices, and lounge. The hotel is situated 300 meters from the Borjomi-Kharagauli National Park.
