According to the Bank's website, the proposed \$20 million direct loan to a special purpose vehicle by PT Amarta Nusantara Raya, (the "Sponsor") will be on-lent to women-owned and led microenterprises operating in Indonesia primarily in rural villages of Indonesia, using its digital, peer-to-peer lending platform, owned by its Subsidiary, PT Amarta Mikro Fintek ("AMF"), a "peer-to-peer" or "P2P" lender organized and licensed under Indonesian law that connects lenders with underserved, primarily rural borrowers.
