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Project Description

The Project is expected to have a positive development impact in Latin America by providing improved access to micro-mobility services to an estimated 1.7 million people across 83 cities. More specifically, the Project will deploy bikeshare services, including electric bikes and an ultrafast charging network, offering a sustainable transport option that has the potential to reduce traffic congestion and air pollution. Working through a stakeholder group, the Project will drive innovation in the carbon credit ecosystem by developing a solution to enable Digital Measurement, Reporting and Verification ("D-MRV") of credits. In addition, the Project will support nearly 500 jobs in its operations and directly enable income-generating activities for more than 100,000 people.
