
Project Description

The brownfield expansion and modernization of the Puerto Bolivar container port in El Oro province in Ecuador (the "Project"), which is being implemented pursuant to a 50-year concession agreement (the "Concession Agreement") will include dredging the approach channel; constructing a new 450-meter berth; constructing a cold-storage warehouse and facilities for handling refrigerated shipping containers; installing new cranes, electric gantries, and other cargo handling equipment; and installing a new security gate and anti-smuggling hardware (e.g., container scanners).
