Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the objective of this project is to finance vaccine procurement and ancillary costs for vaccine allocation to DFC-eligible countries that are participants in the Borrower's core vaccination programs or the COVAX AMC.

The Project is expected to have a positive development impact on low income and lower-middle income countries by increasing access to critical vaccines. Uncertain demand for vaccines, high upfront costs of vaccine development, and disorganized or underfunded national health systems contribute to higher costs of routine vaccines in low-income and lower-middle income countries.

Early Warning System Project Analysis

The Project involves the financing of vaccine acquisition, and as such, is a financial transaction that is screened as a Category C activity for the purposes of environmental and social assessment.
