Project Description

According to EBRD website, the loan will be used to finance the extension of Metro Line III in Kharkiv by 3.5 km to the southern districts of the city and construction of two stations, construction of a new depot and connecting rail and the purchase of rolling stock to service the extended line. Kharkiv is Ukraine's second largest municipality and a major industrial centre.

It will address key challenges in the public transport infrastructure development of the city of Kharkiv, including improving access to clean urban transport and increasing the capacity and efficiency of public transport services. The investment is expected to result in significant economic and environmental benefits through the expansion of clean, zero-emission urban rail mass transit as the backbone of Kharkiv's public transport system to ensure sustainable mobility.

The assignments for technical cooperation are: corporate development support programme, lender's technical monitor and monitoring of implementation of RAP.
