### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The EBRD is considering providing a senior loan of up to EUR 13 million to the Public Utility Company Belgrade Water and Sewerage (the "Company"). The loan proceeds will be used to finance the Company's priority investments in water supply, including construction of a dual pipeline that will feed raw water from the Sava River to the Makis Water Treatment Plant, cleaning of a settling tank where the dual pipeline will be placed, and construction of a 4.8km long pipeline that will transfer water from the Makis catchment area to Banovo Brdo Water Treatment Plant, as well as other priority investments.

### TRANSITION IMPACT

The transition impact potential of the Project arises from:

### THE CLIENT

Public Utility Company Belgrade Waterworks and Sewerage is the sole company providing potable water in Serbia's capital. Its key responsibilities are water collection, treatment and distribution, as well as wastewater collection and discharge.
