Project Description

According to EBRD website, the EBRD is considering development of the Framework to support municipal investments by addressing key environmental challenges a number of Georgian cities are facing. While initial loans will be sovereign with on-lending to Cities and utility companies, the FW will also pursue non-sovereign lending structures. It will seek to mobilise grant financing from international donors for capital investments and technical cooperation to support the broader transition objectives, implementation support and policy dialogue. It will also include engagement with local communities on the benefits of the Green City initiative.

The Technical Cooperation assignments are designed to support the investments at the FW level where possible. Each sub-project will be assessed based on its individual needs and will benefit from the Framework TCs as appropriate depending on the TI for the sub-project.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EBRD
