Project Description

This project finances Bakyrchik Mining Venture LLP to develop the Kyzyl (Bakyrchik) gold deposit located in Northeastern Kazakhstan.

Kyzyl is a world class deposit with estimated JORC reserves of 7.3 Moz of gold at an average grade of 7.7 g/t. The Project is expected to produce up to 1.8 mtpa of ore by open pit mining during the first 10 years. The ore will be processed by sulphide flotation followed by concentrate offtake and/or pressure oxidation (POX).
