Project Description

According to EBRD website, the Belarus Water Sector Framework, EUR 40 million debt facility for water and wastewater investments, approved by the Bank in 2015 is now fully subscribed. The proposed project is an extension of the existing framework consisting of sovereign debt facilities for an aggregate amount of up to EUR 60 million to be provided for water utilities in cities throughout Belarus. It will facilitate critical water and wastewater management improvements in the participating cities, including modernisation of water/wastewater treatment facilities, rehabilitation of the networks, modernisation of pumping stations and purchase of maintenance equipment. The impact of the project will be:

- i. tariff increases
- ii. improvements in operational efficiency
- iii. promotion of transition to a green economy through the support for pollution prevention and reducing the degradation of ecosystems; and
- iv. introduction of improved corporate governance and transparency.
