Project Description

According to EBRD website, the Green Boulevard forms part of the programme of reconstruction and modernisation of tram tracks and streets in Belgrade, which has been ongoing for much of the past 15 years. As identified in the SMART Plan, this programme responds to the need for improvement of the existing streets, integrating improvements to traffic speeds by coordination of traffic signalling and prioritisation of tram (and in future, bus) traffic. The main objectives are: (i) renovation of tram tracks in central Belgrade to allow new trams to operate, and (ii) rehabilitation and expansion of the City's main roads to secure a better and safer traffic flow.
