According to the Bank's website, this project provides financing to the government of the Republic of Kosovo to extend an existing industrial zone in the municipality of Drenas. This will entail the construction of roads and their connection to the main road, a water supply network within the project area, the construction of electrical grids and their connection with the main existing electrical grid. This project also encompasses the construction of a gas network, the construction of a sewage system for the treatment of waste and industrial waters and the construction of a wastewater treatment plant.

The government is yet to complete the Environmental and Social Questionnaire.

The goal of the project is to facilitate investment in Drenas by easing issues of land ownership, expensive land purchase price and lack of infrastructure.
