### Project Description

According to the bank document, the project includes "1) the rehabilitation and the replacement of selected sections of the district heating network, 2) the installation of an energy-efficient booster pumping station, 3) other auxiliary investments, such as upgrading of central heating substations or installing individual heating substations in buildings directly connected to the UBDH network, 4) the construction of a new energy centre to serve the north of the city and 5) the installation of DH accumulators, which could store heat energy either produced during the night hours when the cost of electricity is minimal or at times when CHP plants produce excess heat."

### Investment Description

- European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD)

The project is expected to be co-financed by a capital grant from bi-lateral or multilateral donors or the Special Shareholder Fund (or a combination of donor funding) amounting up to US\$ 5 million (EUR 4.5 million).
