Project Description

Under this project, EBRD provides a sovereign loan of up to US\$ 50 million (EUR 41.3 million) to the Republic of Uzbekistan for the benefit of Horezm Toza Hudud, a state unitary enterprise owned by the State Committee for Ecology and Environmental Protection, to finance the modernisation of solid waste management (SWM) infrastructure in Horezm Region.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The loan proceeds will be used to finance the construction of new EU-compliant sanitary landfills, waste sorting plants, waste transfer stations and supply of special equipment and vehicles. The project is expected to bring significant health and environmental benefits and result in greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions savings.
