Project Description

According to EBRD website, the project aims to construct new and rehabilitate the existing water and wastewater infrastructure, jointly with investment grants from the EU Operational Programme Environment 2014-2020. The main objectives of the Project are: (a) to help the Company achieve full compliance with the EU Urban Waste Water Treatment Directive in all agglomerations of more than 10,000 people serviced by the Company and (b) improve the efficiency of water supply services, reduce the share of nonrevenue water and fulfil the requirements of the EU Drinking Water Directive.

ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EBRD

The Project Complaint Mechanism (PCM) is the independent complaint mechanism and fact-finding body for people who have been or are likely to be adversely affected by an European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD)-financed project. If you submit a complaint to the PCM, it may assess compliance with EBRD's own policies and procedures to prevent harm to the environment or communities or it may assist you in resolving the problem that led to the complaint through a dialogue with those implementing the project. Additionally, the PCM has the authority to recommend a project be suspended in the event that harm is imminent.
