Project Description

This project involves provision of a senior secured loan of up to EUR 10 million to Transped s.r.o., a Slovakian subsidiary (the "Borrower") of the Grain Alliance Group. The Loan will be provided under the Resilience and Livelihoods Framework.

The proceeds of the Loan will be used to finance the upgrade and expansion of storage and transshipment capacity of the grain terminal and purchase of trucks and locomotives in Slovakia, as well as purchase of grain hoppers in Ukraine (the "Project").

Additionally, the PCM has the authority to recommend a project be suspended in the event that harm is imminent.
