### Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the project consists of the provision of a sovereign loan of up to EUR 5 million to the Republic of North Macedonia to finance Rail Joint Border Station ("RJBS") in Tabanovce, at the border between North Macedonia and Serbia, on rail Corridor X, which is part of the TEN-T Networks extension to the Western Balkans. The funds will finance the upgrade of the existing rail station buildings and the construction of additional new buildings including an access road of approximately 500m. The Project will be co-financed by the EU through an investment grant from the Western Balkans Investment Framework ("WBIF").
