Project Description

As stated by the EBRD, the project consists of the provision of a sovereign loan of up to US\$ 250 million to the Republic of Uzbekistan for the benefit of the Ministry of Water Resources (MWR), to finance the modernisation of pumping stations (PSs) for irrigation water conveyance (IWC) in 10 regions of Uzbekistan. The project complements the second phase to the ongoing EBRD transaction (Phase I) which covers the modernisation of 118 PSs in the three regions of Fergana Valley in the country.

The project is expected to enhance the resilience to climate change by improving energy and water efficiency in the national IWC system.
