## Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the project consists of a Portfolio Risk Sharing ("PRS") in the form of an unfunded portfolio guarantee of up to EUR50 million provided by the Bank in favour of Erste Bank AD Novi Sad ("EBS"). The guarantee will cover up to 50% of the credit risk on a pro rata basis on the newly-generated micro, small and medium-sized enterprise ("MSME") loan portfolio of up to EUR100 million originated by EBS.

The product aims to release EBS' risk-taking capacity to boost on-lending to MSMEs, addressing an MSME financing gap in the market.

### **Early Warning System Project Analysis**

Categorised FI (ESP 2024). ERSTE BANK AD NOVI SAD is an existing client of the EBRD. The client is currently meeting the EBRD's Environmental and Social Requirements (ESRs) 2, 4, and 9 under its existing EBRD exposures. Eligible subprojects will support MSME finance, which are likely to be of low environmental and social risk. The main E&S risks relate to the client's capacity to implement its ESMS.

## Financial Intermediary

Financial Intermediary: A commercial bank or financial institution that receives funds from a development bank. A financial intermediary then lends these funds to their clients (private actors) in the form of loans, bonds, guarantees and equity shares. Financial intermediaries include insurance, pension and equity funds. The direct financial relationship is between the development bank and the financial intermediary.
