Project Description

According to the Bank's website, the project consists of the provision of a senior unsecured loan to Intesa Leasing d.o.o.

Beograd ("ILS") in the amount of up to EUR25 million under the Regional Western Balkans ("WB") Green Outcomes-Linked Debt ("GOLD") Financing Framework. The loan will be fully guaranteed by Banca Intesa Beograd ("BIB").

The proceeds of the Bank's investment will be used for providing leases to eligible small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and Midcaps in Serbia in support of their business expansion and Green Economy Transition ("GET") eligible investments. At least 50% of the total investment will be GET eligible.

The main E&S risks relate to the client's capacity to implement its Environmental and Social Management System (ESMS).
