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## Project Description

According to EIB website, the proposed EIB loan will support the promoter's capital investments for (i) the construction of a new production facility for upholstered furniture, (ii) the acquisition, installation and ramp-up of the related equipment for furniture production, as well as (iii) a new fully equipped storage facility over the period 2017-19. Over time the investment is expected to create up to 500 new jobs. It aims to support its planned growth by increasing its manufacturing and warehousing capacity as the current installed capacity and space available does not allow for the forecast volumes.

The project is eligible for the bank's financing with minor negative environmental residual impact.

### ACCOUNTABILITY MECHANISM OF EIB

When dissatisfied with a complaint to the EIB Complaints Mechanism, citizens can then turn towards the European Ombudsman. A memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the EIB and the European Ombudsman establishes that citizens (even outside of the EU if the Ombudsman finds their complaint justified) can turn towards the Ombudsman on issues related to 'maladministration' by the EIB. Note that before going to the Ombudsman, an attempt must be made to resolve the case by contacting the EIB. In addition, the complaint must be made within two years of the date when the facts on which your complaint is based became known to you.
